

LOCAL MARKET.

WEEKLY REVIEW.

While there were considerable fluctuations in prices at the markets held here during the past week, the only severe decline was for live hogs. Trade on the whole was about up to the average.
Grain—Oats are lower, at \$1 to \$1.15 per cwt; most of the best loads sell at \$1.10 per cwt. Wheat is easier, at \$82 per bu. Barley is steady, at \$1.10 to \$1.15 per cwt. Peas, 70c to 80c per bu.

Hay and Straw—Hay is in good demand, and prices are firm at \$11 and \$11.50 for choice and \$10 to \$10.50 for medium quality. Straw is in fair demand at \$2.50 per ton.
Butter and Eggs—Butter is a scarce commodity at present, especially for choice dairy; prices are higher than last week's quotations; sales are made at 25c for choice and 24c for medium quality. Eggs are in light supply and prices are firm, at 22c per dozen for crate fairs and 23c for basket lots; for candied stock the dealers quote at 25c to 26c per dozen.

Potatoes—The demand is low at present; colder weather will no doubt stimulate trade, as most of the grocers and dealers are availing themselves of the winter supply while the middle weather continues; prices are easier, at 75c and 80c per bag by the load; some contracts have been made at 80c to 85c per bu.

Fruits—Peaches are about done for this season; the demand is fair, at 50c to 60c per basket, according to size and quality; pears are in fair demand at 75c to 80c per bu; grapes, 25c to 30c per basket; chestnuts sold at 35c per bu; apples are slow and the quality is mostly inferior; sales are made at 25c to 30c per bu.

Poultry—The dealers state that the quantity offered at present is fairly large. They quote the following prices: Old fowl, alive, 6c per lb. and 7c to 8c dressed; chickens, alive, 8c to 9c per lb. and 10c to 12c dressed; the latter price being paid for what is termed heavy ducks, alive, 7c per lb. and 8c to 10c dressed; turkeys, 10c per lb. alive and 12c dressed.

Dressed Hogs—The market is easier, at \$8.50 and \$9 per cwt.
Live Hogs—Prices are considerably lower, \$9.10 per cwt being paid here last Monday; what the price will be for next Monday's shipment is not yet known; it will, however, likely be a little higher; small pigs are a dull sale, at \$4.50 to \$5 per cwt for pigs 6 to 10 weeks old.
Butchers' Meat—Beef is steady, at \$2.50 to \$3 per cwt; veal easier, at \$3.50 to \$4 per cwt; lamb steady, at \$5.50 to \$6 per cwt; mutton, at \$5.50 to \$6 per cwt.

Hides—There is no change in the price of hides; the leading markets are weak, and prices may go lower; sales are made at \$6 for No. 1, 7c for No. 2, and 6c for No. 3 grades of cow hides; calfskins sell at 10c per lb.; lambskins, 60c each.

Wool is dull, at 13c for washed and 8c for unwashed.
Honey—Trade is steady and prices unchanged, at \$1.50 to \$1.80 per dozen for sections and 8c per lb. for strained.

Cheese—The demand has been a little slack during the week, but there is no material alteration in prices, although the slightly easier cables are having a depressing effect on the market, but the improved enquiry there would quickly be a better feeling, as retail dealers are not stocked. No change in the position of English cheeses, which is plentiful and cheap. We quote today: Finest States and Canadian, white and colored, 98c to 22c per cwt; fine States, flats and cheddars, very few, 95c to 100c; English cheese, according to quality, 54c to 72c per 120 lbs.
Butter—There is no change in the market, which rules steady but quiet. Danish arrivals did not this week make the full advance, the quotation for next week being unchanged. The outlook for the new season's New Zealand is to higher prices, factormen refusing to sell except at an advance over buyers' present ideas. Secondary butter fairly plentiful, but in moderate request. We report today's values as under: Choicest Canadian creamery, in 56-lb boxes, 115c to 118c per cwt; choice Danish, 115c to 118c; choice Russian and Siberian, do, 105c to 110c; secondary grades, do, 105c to 108c; choice Australian and New Zealand, 115c to 118c; choicest Irish creamery, 115c to 118c; choicest States creamery, nominally 100c to 105c; States flats, imitations and process, dull, 92c to 95c.
