Jeff Prefers a Job With Less Class and More Safety.

CLAIMS PICTURES ARE ONLY COPIES

New York, Jan. 24.—David Rogo, a pearl merchant, yesterday brought suit against Granby Staunton Howard of Ottawa, Canada, alleging that of 87 supposed old masters he recently purchased from him almost all have been discovered to be copies. The purchase price was to have been \$150,000, of which \$15,000 was paid within ten days after the deal, the remainder being covered by notes.

Were the paintings as represented, Rogo said, the lot would have been worth \$1,000,000. Rogo's attorneys say he purchased the paintings for speculation and did not engage experts to make an appraisal.

Experts examined the paintings after they had been shipped to New York from Canada last November, the purchaser's lawyers claim, and declared they believed them to have been painted by students of the masters represented. Attorneys for the seller deny that he misrepresented his collections, declaring that the paintings were not described as "old masters."

New York Commissioner to ISOLATE FLU CASES
 New York, Jan. 24.—Health department inspectors are today watching all incoming ships for cases of flu. Dr. Royal S. Copeland, city health commissioner, believes that New York's increasing cases of influenza may be due, in part, to importations from Europe. All ships will be watched from today on, and cases of influenza found on them will be isolated.

BELIEVE BARREN RIDGE CONTAINS RADIUM ORE
 SASKATOON, Jan. 23.—Deposits of pitchblende, the mineral which contains radium, may shortly be located in the country north of The Pas, according to S. S. Reynolds, the mining engineer who located the Mandy Mine.

Mr. Reynolds is awaiting reports from a trapper, regarding a barren ridge in the North Country on which the snow does not lie in the winter. It was discovered by him that a similar ridge in Northern Ontario contained a considerable deposit of the precious ore, the radium.
