McDonald had been in Skagway, and upon his return some one told him that Jones was looking for him, prepared to shoot. Soon after the two men met, and Jones, with the remark, "Your time has come?" tried to shoot McDonald. Mc-Donald, however, got his gun first and fired four shots at Jones, all four taking effect. Jones lived for several hours. An inquest was held, and the coroner's jury exonerated McDonald for the kill-ing, finding that he had acted in self-defence. Jones has been known as a man with very fanatical ideas on some subjects. At the time of President Mc-Kinley's death he said that he was glad that he was dead.

MORE ERUPTION. Mount Pelee Seems Again to Be Active.

Port de France, Island of Martinique, May 16.—Great flashes of very bright light were emitted from Mount Pelee be-tween 10 and 11 o'clock last night. They were visible from here. Thick glowing red clouds, interspersed with flashes of light, were issuing from the volcano this morning. Showers of cin-ders, lasting for 20 minutes, accompanied the activity.
