**PLYMPTON COUNCIL.**

Plympton council of 1906 met Jan. 9th  
to complete Court of Revision on the Ram-  
sey drain. Members all present except  
Councillor Paul. Minutes of last meeting  
were read and approved.  
The Court reduced the assessment on Jas.  
McEwen's farm \$15.00 placing \$8.00 of it on  
school section No. 5 and \$7.00 on the  
municipality, and the assessment on Robt.  
Hart's farm was reduced \$15.00 assumed by  
the township.

The by-law was finally passed Bailey  
and Hart being appointed commissioners  
and council adjourned sine die.  
Council elect for 1907 met as per statute  
on the 14th inst., consisting of all the mem-  
bers of the old council with the exception  
of one, Mr. A. Watson, as follows:—  
Reeve—Robt. Bailey.  
Deputy Reeve—J. McLean.  
Councillors—R. Hart, A. Watson and R.  
McKinley.

After signing the declaration of office and  
qualification, the following officers were ap-  
pointed:—  
Clerk—J. K. Cairns salary \$125.  
Assessor—Wm. E. Dodge, salary \$50.  
Thos. Neatbit was also an applicant for  
assessorship his tender being \$65.  
Auditors—C. C. McDougall and P. Mc-  
Ewen, salary \$12 each.  
Solicitor—W. J. Hanns retaining fee  
\$25.00.  
Treasurer—I. D. Paul, salary \$10.  
Janitor—Thos. Burnley, salary \$9.00.  
Members of Board of Health—Reeve and  
clerk ex-officio, and Jos. McCormick, Jas.  
McLean and Ralph Rogers.  
M. H. O.—Dr. Brown.  
Sanitary Inspector—Jas. McLean, Sr.

the fact that the statutes require him to  
make his report 30 days after laying out the  
work on a drain, there are cases where  
drains are now standing for three or four  
months.

The clerk was instructed to order copies  
of the Municipal World for councillors and

Pt. Co. for 8 poll books, etc., \$7.60; F.  
W. Flater, survey, etc., Peacock drain \$38;  
F. W. Flater, survey, etc., Hoyle ditch \$22;  
F. W. Flater, survey, etc., Henderson  
ditch, \$10; grant to Sick Children's  
Hospital, Toronto \$10; Municipal World,  
assessment rolls and stationery \$25.30;  
Standard Printing Co., 5 drain bylaws and  
balance on account \$32.82; J. B. Richard-  
son, loss of steer in road ditch \$12; Bailey  
and McLean, commission on Archer drain  
each \$17; J. D. Paul, salary, stationery  
and exchange \$171.83; Thos. Burnley,  
salary as janitor and repairing \$9.20 The  
Clerk to pay election expenses \$75; the  
Clerk expensing on stationery \$1.25; the  
Clerk registering 73 births, 16 marriages  
and 48 deaths, \$9.40.  
Council reconvened Feb. 9th at 10 a.m.  
for general business.
