Jack Reid, son of Jos. Reid, Petrolia is home from the front. He went overseas with the 70th Battalion in April 1918 and was awarded the Military Medal for previous military experiences. He was one of the 430 soldiers chosen to attend King George's coronation in 1911. After reaching England was for a year instructor at a military school, then returned to private to enable him to get to France. Went with the 21st Batt. as bomber. First under fire during summer of 1917. Saw service in Belgium and France. He had his knee twisted in the big push in the spring of last year, to right of Arras. He was sent to England and was in hospital until armistice was declared.
