So we are preparing the children of the day school and some of the evangelistic schools for that test. All are working with a zest. Those who pass receive printed certificates from the headquarters of the I. S. S. Union at Calcutta.

We enjoyed a tour in Calinga. Bro. Amenthalal, pastor of Chicacole Church, and six of the helpers in S. S. work accompanied us and they worked untiringly, walking long distances to the villages and giving earnest testimony. Day after day the little chapel was filled. Inquirers often came to the bungalow, which we had rented on account of its pleasant position o'erlooking the sea. We had hoped that some would come out fully on the Lord's side. Since our return we received a card to the following effect :-- "Three of us wish to join. We are believing in Christ in all things. We have great joy in our hearts and thank you all for teaching us the Way of Salvation. Come again soon, please.

Please pray for your representatives more earnestly than ever before. Pray that we who hold forth the Word of Life may in all things walk worthily of our high calling : pray that we may fulfil the command "Disciple the Nations" not only in proclaiming the Gospel but in lovingly persuading men to receive Christ as the Lord of the heart, and the Saviour of soul.

I would thank you each and all for your prayers and help. Please hold the ropes very strongly. The enemy is mighty. Iniquity reigns. Our greatest need is an enducment of power from on high

May the God of peace Himself give you His own peace and may your work in church and home be abundantly blessed.
