POTATOES AND ROAST BEEF.-Potatoes which are to be served with roast beef are very nice cooked in this way: Boli them and when they are done and peeled, warm them up in melted butter, sprinkle with chopped parsley, and serve in a hot dish.

FRIED GREEN TOMATOES .- Green toma-FRIED GREEN TOMATOES.—Green forma-toes fried are preferred by some people to the egg-plane, and it may well take its place; cut the outer slices off, and then cut the inner part in slices about half an inch thick, roll them in flour, and fry in butter; sprinkle pepper and salt on them. GOOSEBERRY CATSUP.—Ten pounds of tipe gooseberries, five pounds of white sugar, a quart of good cider vinegar, three table-spoonfuls of ground cinnamon, two table-spoonfuls of ground cloves, one of allspice, and two of salt. Wash, remove blossoms, put into a preserving keitle, crush, heat through, then pass through a fine colander. Return to the fire, and sugar and spice, boil slowly half an bour, add vinegar and bottle.

Skim and apply when cold. The casks should also be carefully prepared. The gum and sap in the wood may be remayed by thoroughly steaming with a high pressure, or by soaking in brine till the wood is saturated and then filling the cask with boiling brine and letting it stand until cold. By keeping the cask in a cool place and the butter under the brine, the butter will keep zafely.

TOMATO PIE. - A receipt for tomato pie is contributed by a Southern lady Peel and slice enough green tomatoes to fill one pie; to this allow tour tablespoonfuls of vinegar, one of butter, and three and a half of sugar, flavour with nutmen, bake with two crusts very slowly.
