WHEAT IN CANADA.

Stocks of wheat in Canada at principal points of accumulation are reported as follows:

Total, March 11 9,257,000 BRADSTREET'S REPORT OF STOOKS.

Total stocks in the United States and Canada, cast of the Rocky Mountains, as reported by Bradstreet's on March 11, were 51,102,000 bushels.

Total stocks in the United States and Canada a year ago were 44,167 bushels, according to Bradstreet's report. Pacific coast wheat stocks on March 1 were 5,101,000 bushels, compared with 4,424,000 bushels a year ago.

The Chicago visible supply statement of stocks in the United States and Canada, cast of the Rocky Mountains, for the week ended March 18, was 29,992,000 bushels, being an increase of 193,000 bushels for the week. A year ago the visible supply was 32,417,000 tushels, two years ago 40,439,000 bushels, and four years ago 75,773, 00 bushels.
