

Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 37, as follows:

That an Order of the House do issue for copies of contracts, correspondence, agreements and papers for each year 1970 to 1974 relating to dredging contracts in (a) Toronto (b) Quebec City (c) Île d'Orléans (d) Cap-de-la-Roche (e) South Baymouth (f) Hamilton,

having been called was, at the request of the honourable Member for Edmonton Centre (Mr. Paproski), transferred by the Clerk to the order of "Notices of Motions (Papers)" pursuant to Standing Order 48(1).

The honourable Member for Bellechasse (Mr. Lambert) from his place in the House, asked leave under Standing Order 26 to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a specific and important matter requiring urgent consideration, and stated the subject to be: "the continuing longshoremen's strike in the ports of Quebec City, Trois-Rivières and Montreal prevents millers from getting the feed grain supplies normally required for animal feed and endangers the life of thousands of animals".

And leave having been granted to propose a motion to adjourn the House in order to discuss the matter, the motion to adjourn was allowed to stand over until 8.00 o'clock p.m. this day.

The Order being read for the third reading of Bill C-13, An Act to amend the Northern Canada Power Commission Act;

Mr. Buchanan, seconded by Mr. Gillespie, moved,—That the Bill be now read a third time and do pass.
