I apologize sincerely for not letting you know yesterday what I thought of your letter to Mr. Walter Mitchell with reference to the suggestion which has been made regarding the further consolidation of the affairs of Protestant education on the Island of Montreal. I cordially agree with the points you have made in your letter to Mr. Mitchell: 1st, that substantial economies will result from the consolidation proposed; 2nd, that the success of this consolidation will depend largely upon the qualifications of the men who are appointed to the Board.
