My dear Tom:-

Upon my return from the hospital a day or so ago I found your letter of June 2nd. I also found in the same mail a letter from Mr. Hargreaves in which he states that the Transportation Company would not allow him any stop-over privileges and therefore he was unable to spend any time in Montreal. I was in the hospital when he went through and could not get in touch with him.

His letter to me says nothing about joining the Mounted Police but he is anxious that I help him get a position in some electrical company. That is rather a hard thing to do in the circumstances, but I do not think he will have much difficulty in view of the fact that there is considerable development in the world of electrical engineering here.

I am sailing by the Montcalm on the 26th for the Old Country and hope to spend a couple of months over there.
