

VERY LITTLE LIFE SHOWN ON MARKET

Large Number of Fresh Arrivals at Stock Yards Caused Dulness.

A DRUG ON THE MARKET

Heavy Cattle, at Prices Asked, Very Slow Sale at Present.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Wednesday were 21 carloads, comprising 650 cattle, 237 hogs, 405 sheep and lambs, 140 calves and 389 horses...

Prices were about the same in all classes of fat cattle, as on Tuesday, and quite a few again unsold at the close of the market.

Outside of a light demand for the American market there were few stockers and feeders wanted, but values remained the same.

Receipts of sheep and lambs were larger, and prices were easier on account of quality not being good as a rule.

Choice heavy butchers' cattle sold at \$2.25 to \$3.50; choice outchows' steers and hogs, \$2.20 to \$3.50; good, \$1.50 to \$2.50...

Good to choice, 500 to 800-lb. steers sold at \$7.40 to \$7.65; medium, 700 to 800-lb. steers, sold at \$5.25 to \$5.50...

Choice calves sold at \$9 to \$10; good at \$7.60 to \$8.75; medium at \$7 to \$7.50; common calves at \$5 to \$6.

Receipts of hogs were liberal, and as a consequence values were no higher, in fact barely steady at \$9.50 to \$9.85, weighed off cars.

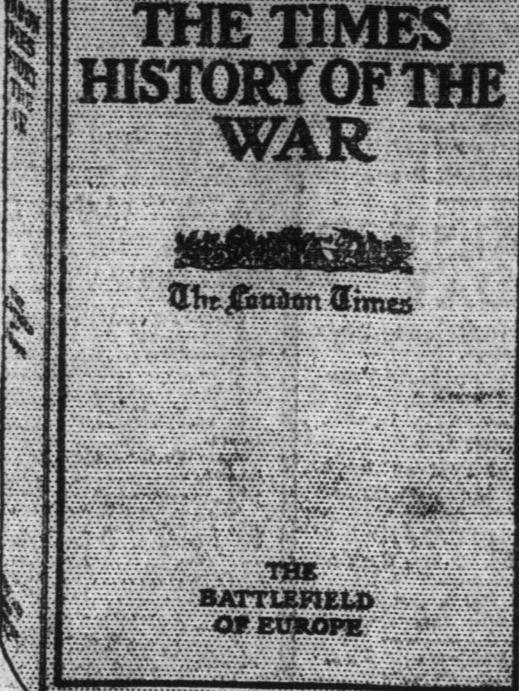

Austrian Fleet Copies Von Tirpitz's Tactics

Italian Warships Looking in Vain for Signs of the Enemy.

ROME, June 2.—Announcement was made at the ministry of marine today that the Italian fleet spent all of yesterday in cruising off the Austrian coast, without sighting the Austrian fleet. The statement follows:

"Yesterday our fleet cruised the entire day near the Dalmatian archipelago without sighting the enemy.

While waiting our ships destroyed a newly installed semaphore and wireless station on the Island of Lissa, which was re-established after the bombardment by the French fleet last November.

"Our ships also destroyed the observation station north of the Island of Curzola. (Signed) "Thaon Di Revel," (Chief of Naval Staff)
