VII No pilot shall demand and take more than at the rate of eleven shillings for every foot of water the veffel he shall have piloted between Bic and Quebec may draw, under the penalty of forty shillings.

VIII. If any pilot shall from negligence lose a vessel, he shall for ever after be incapacitated from acting as a pilot.

IX. A lift of the names of the pilots with their ages and places of abode, shall be affixed by the superintendant of the pilots in fome contpicuous place of the Cuftom-houfe at Quebec, by the twentieth day of April every year, under the penalty of forty fhillings.

X. Every pilot within hailing or fight of any veffel in diffeau trefs, shall if possible go on board, and he shall there remain et fe and use his best endeavours to get her into a place of fatety; fi au and if any pilots fhall neglect or refuse such duty, he shall by tel ra such negect or refufal be incapacitated from acting as a pilot.

The pilot who boards a veffel in diffrefs, shall be paid XI. by the mafter all fuch reafonable charges as fhall be afcertained by two shipmasters chosen by the parties and the captain of the port, or a majority of them, regard being had to the pilot's rifk and trouble in his endeavours to fecure the vefiel.

XII. No pilot shall on any pretence leave the veffel he piloted before she is moored at Quebec, or made fast to fome wharf, without leave from the matter, under the penalty of one half of the pilotage, to be paid to the master of the vessel fo left, on his fuing for the fame.

XIII. The superintendant of the pilots shall order a suffifuffifi cient number of pilots to ply conftantly at Bic, not lefs than que o four boats with their full compliment, in rotation from the twençinqu ty-fifth of April to the fifteenth of November every year, there to be ready to conduct thips and veffels up the River to Quebec, under the penalty of ten pounds.

XIV. No licenced pilot shall refute to pilot any of his Majefty's ships when thereunto duly required, nor shall misbehave himstelf on board any flip or veffel under his charge as pilot, nor thall refufe to obey any lawful command of the tuperintendint of pilots, under the penalty of being fulpended from his employment for fix months at leaft, and if during that fuspenilon,

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
