HIGH PRICES NOT HELD

Sharp Fluctuations Occur in
Futures at Chicago—Cables
Are Higher.

 Liverpool wheat futures closed today
 1/4 higher than on Saturday, and
 corn futures 1/4 to 1/2 higher.
 At Chicago only wheat closed 1/4 higher
 than yesterday; July, 1/2 lower, and
 July oats 1/4 lower.
 Winnipeg car lots wheat today 2/4, year
 ago 1/4.
 Chicago car lots wheat today 52, con-
 tract 37; corn 72, contract 67; week ago 37,
 year ago 1/4.
 Primary receipts today: Wheat 201,000,
 shipments 637,000; week ago 281,000, 460,
 000; year ago 227,000, 282,000. Corn to-
 day 430,000, shipments 1,411,000,
 070,000; year ago 321,000, 230,000.
