

Dairy Products.

The market for cheese is not in a wery satisfactory condition, and exporters allege that goods cannot be placed by cable at the prices being pald on some of the country boards. The London market is weak and steadily declining.

Regarding butter, The Montreal Trade Review observes:

"There has been quite a scramble for choice grass butter since our last issue, sales of creamery having been reported to us at 16% to 17c for finest selected, and it is difficult to secure perfect goods under the outside figure. Sales are also reported at 16c to 16½c, but the quality was below choice selected. The sales reported to us this week in the country and on spot aggregate between 5000 and 6000 packages. The greater portion of this butter is for export, to go into cold storage on the other side, and part of it will be put into refrigerators in this city for account of English firms, to await shipping instructions. Local buyers have not let exporters have all their own way, but have been buying alongsile them for storing in refrigerators, as they consider present prices good value. The shipments for the season to date amount to about '11,000 packages, against 2700 packages for the corresponding period last year, showing an increase of about 400 percent, and if they continue at this rate the close of navigation will make a good showing. It has been represented to us that the recent buying for English account has not been for immediate consumption on the other side, but for cold storage, as firms there always take a lot of our June creamery for that purpose every year. This may account for the apparent incongruity of an easy market in England and a firm one here." Dairy Products.

Henry Clews of New York, in his weekly letter, says: Existing conditions do not afford much help to operations undertaken to depress values, and they may soon prove a bar to the systematic marking down of prices now in process. Experienced operators of large means, however, are able, within certain limitations, to force the market in a direction contrary to its natural drift, and when there is a comparative absence of sanguine outside support, their success is all the easier. My own view, however, is that the present artificial pressure on prices is not likely to proceed much further without developing buying which may obstruct the tactics of those who, for the moment, are playing a "bear game."

The breaking up of the great Leiter speculation in wheat is not unlikely to lead to some revival of operations in stocks. The immense transactions in grain have drawn off speculation from the Stock Exchange for several months past, and both at Chicago and here the uncertainties about the wheat situation may be expected to divert attention back to stocks under the encouragement of the current downward drift of prices.
