was completed yesterday afternoon,

when Premier Whitney was sworn in

as president of the council. J. J. Foy,

sworn in as attorney-general, and Frank

Cochrane, formerly of Sudbury, as minister

of lands and mines.

Yesterday afternoon, immediately

after the council decided upon the

change, and the appointment of Mr.

Cochrane, the minister of crown lands

was formally administered by Mr.

Cochrane, clerk of the council.

Mr. Cochrane, not being a member

of the legislature, will have to contest

the nomination for the seat in the

legislature, which will be held on

June 1. The nominations take place

June 1, and the election one week later,

June 20.

Mr. Cochrane has been engaged

in the hardware and mining business in

Sudbury. He left last night for the

north to look after his interests.
