Trial Expenses-A Romantle Career.

Chicago, Aug. 11.-Michael C. Mc-Donald is dead. Chicago's ertswhile nonarch of the gambling table, former politician and spectacular figure in the early days when fortunes were made and lost on the turn of the cards, passed away at the Hospital o'clock yesterday afternoon. He was 68 years old.

"Mike" McDonald's end came peacefully while he was surrounded by a little group of sorrowing relatives, among whom were his divorced wife, Mrs. Mary McDonald, and the present spouse, Dora McDonaid, who is awaiting trial for the murder of Webster C. Guerin. The man whose checkered and at times tragic career brought him in the limelight perhaps more often than any other man who ranked as a successful gambler had been in a state of coma for several

A great part of his "Stikhotvoreniya" is devoted to the Ismailoff Guards, its past glories, and its youthful associations.
