EMPLOYERS' GROUP OF CANADA OPPOSED TO EIGHT-HOUR DAY

Statutory Enactment in Canada Would Do Harm.

FEAR U. S. COMPETITION

Unless It Applied in U. S. Also
Canada Would Be At
Disadvantage.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—(By the Associated Press.)—Proceedings of the international labor conference this afternoon were formal. While prolonged, owing to the necessity of many translations, they consisted merely in the election of officers and the choice of a selection committee, which will choose the various committees considered necessary.

It was hoped that the conference would begin discussion on the eight-hour day, but this was found to be impracticable and the conference was adjourned till Monday morning. The Canadian employers' group has practically determined what its attitude will be when the eight-hour day comes before the conference. The group was in caucus during the day. The view generally expressed at the caucus, it is understood, was that a general statutory enactment of the eight-hour day in Canada at the present time should be strongly opposed. The probability of heavy competition from the United States, if the eight-hour day were adopted in Canada, was particularly emphasized.

Unfair Competition.
Statistics submitted went to show that less than fifteen per cent of American workmen engaged in manufacturing were now working under 50 hours a week, and it was claimed that if the eight-hour day were not also applied generally in the United States Canadian industry would be subjected to unfair competition. Principal officers selected by the conference are: Chairman, W. B. Wilson, United States secretary of labor. Vice-chairman, government delegates, R. H. G. N. Barnes, Great Britain; employers' nominee, Jules Cartier, Belgium; workers' nominee, Leon Jouhaux, France. Senator Robertson was chosen to represent Canada on the committee of selection.

EIGHT-HOUR DAY INDORSED BY CLERGY

Catholic Priests of Essex and Kent
Approve of Short Day for
Workmen.

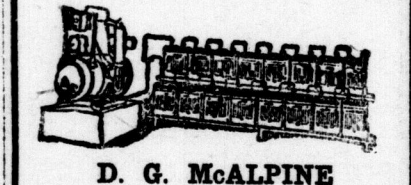
WINDSOR, Oct. 31.—Priests of Roman Catholic churches of Kent and Essex counties meeting in annual conference here today indorsed the principle of an eight-hour day for workmen. The discussion grew out of the presentation of the Encyclical of Pope Leo XIII, issued in 1891, in which his holiness expressed his belief that "to defraud anyone of wages that are his due is a crime which cries to the avenging anger of heaven."

Russian N.W. Army Resumes Offensive Against Bolsheviks

STOCKHOLM, Oct. 31.—The Russian Legation here today received a report from the Northwest Army, dated Wednesday, which says:
"The Bolsheviks attempt to surround our left wing east of Taarskoe-Seio miscarried. We resumed the offensive and occupied the important cross roads near the village of Vineszskaya, close to Krasnoye Seio, taking 2,500 prisoners and many machine guns. We are continuing to advance."
