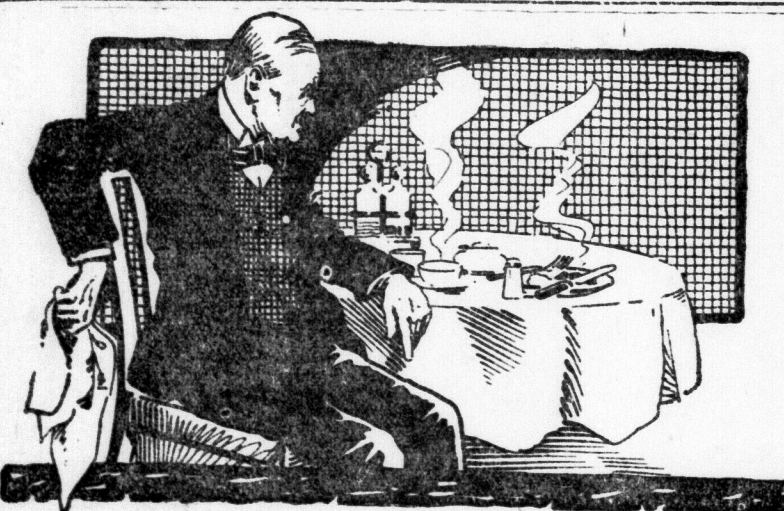

IMMEDIATE RISE IN SUGAR PRICE, REFINERS STATE

Predict Increase At Commerce Board Inquiry Into Problem.

SHORTAGE IN FUTURE

Price Expected To Go Up Two Cents Now and Two Cents Later.

OTTAWA, May 25.—(Canadian Press.)—Immediate increase in the price of sugar at Canadian refineries was indicated in the statements made by refiners at an informal inquiry held by the board of commerce today into the sugar problem in Canada.

Parties well posted on the situation afterwards expressed the opinion that this increase will amount to about two cents a pound, will go into effect this week, and will be followed by a similar increase within a couple of months. Wholesalers and retailers' profits on handling sugar are a percentage of the price, so that the increase to the consumer will be proportionately more than two cents a pound.

The present retail price is about 22 cents a pound. Present sugar prices in Canada are based on advantageous purchase by refiners when raw sugar was less than half the price as at present. It is without doubt that retail sugar prices are considerably higher in the United States than in Canada, and that the Canadian refiners have not taken the 50 cents per cwt. allowed them under the present sugar control. It was said that the present retail price in Canada does not come within several cents of the cost of production in Canada's refineries on account of the greatly increased cost of raw sugar in Cuba.

Were Not Represented.

Neither refiners nor consumers were represented at the hearing. That Canadians are obtaining sugar at a reasonable cost, was the keynote of a statement made by W. F. O'Connor, K.C., sugar commissioner for the board of commerce, at the beginning of the inquiry. Mr. O'Connor stated that the board had kept in closest touch with conditions in Canada, was in possession of all the facts of the sugar market, but wished to give the public an opportunity of hearing the facts. The object of the inquiry is to obtain information which will enable the board to decide whether it would be in the public interest that sugar should be sold at a lower price than it is at present.

Representatives of the Canada Dominion, St. Lawrence and Acadia refineries are attending the hearing. Wholesalers are represented by A. C. Pyke, secretary of the Canadian Wholesale Grocers' Association.

Are Selling Lower.

The opening argument of the refiners is that, compelled to buy raw material in a common market in Cuba and faced with higher cost of transportation and refining, Canadian refiners are selling at lower rates of profit than the United States refiners. Shortage of raw sugar threatens the continuity of the supply on the continent and indicates a probable further rise in the cost of raw sugar.

Some mention of sugar stringency brought from Mr. O'Connor a remark that there has been no sign of a sugar shortage so far. Two refineries had been closed for some time, and no effect was visible on the existing stock. It was months ahead that must be thought of, when a real shortage threatened. Why should not refiners ration their output and conserve the supply?

A. H. Thompson of the Canada Refinery said that he did not know how this could be done. There seemed to be no way of avoiding a substantial increase in sugar prices before the end of the year.

SAYS UNITED STATES MAY BE DEPENDENT ON OVERSEAS FOOD

Hoover Fears Decrease in Agricultural Production.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—Decrease in agricultural production may result in the United States becoming dependent on overseas food supplies, Herbert Hoover today declared in letters to Representative Riddick, Republican, Montana, setting forth the former food administrator's views as to present measures to insure returns to the farmer for his labor and investment.

Asserting that present high prices of commodities sooner or later will decrease, Mr. Hoover said: "This deflation must not begin on the farmer. Shortage in production outside the United States, and the consequent misuse of extended credits, speculation and profiteering and non-essential production were contributing to the present inflated prices, he wrote. When the collapse occurred, he predicted, intermediate dealers would be able to pass the greatest portion to the back of the farmer, no matter how carefully handled, he added.

CANADA TO DISCUSS AFTER-WAR QUESTIONS WITH COALITION GOVT.

LONDON, May 25.—In view of the approaching conference at Spa it has been decided to revive the British Empire delegation. The four dominions, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa have been asked to nominate a representative who will discuss with the imperial cabinet the various questions arising out of the war.

U. S. GOVERNMENT CHARGES HOARDING OF SUGAR SUPPLY

BOSTON, May 25.—The Federal Government today took action against sugar refiners here for alleged profiteering and hoarding. The Revere Sugar Refinery and Henry E. Worcester, its vice-president, were charged with exacting excessive prices and withholding sugar from the market, and the American Sugar Refining Company and W. K. Green, its general manager, were charged with selling sugar at excessive prices. The complaints asserted that the companies had made millions of dollars by hoarding and regulating the price.

REPORTS GROWING TENDENCY TO THRIFT

CHICAGO, May 25.—A growing tendency toward thrift, a general revision downward of prices of all commodities, except food, and improvement in the labor situation, are three encouraging factors noted in the report of the seventh federal reserve district issued today.

WANTS STRIKE TRUCE TO REDUCE PRICES

LAKE MOHONK, N. Y., May 25.—A truce on strikes was pronounced the only way to bring down the cost of living, in a statement on the causes of high prices and inflated commercial values endorsed by the savings banks association of the state of New York at its annual convention here today. "Let everybody go to work and produce more," the statement reads.

IRISH RAILMEN WILL NOT CARRY WAR MATERIALS

Refuse To Transport Guns or Explosives To West Ireland.

CAVALRY IN W. MEATH

Flying Columns Used—Court-House Burned Down in Tobbercurry, Sligo.

DUBLIN, May 25.—A serious extension of the railway trouble here occurred this morning, when the railwaymen refused to transport war materials which had been landed from a steamer and loaded into a train by soldiers after the dockers declined to work.

The supplies were destined for the West of Ireland, and the soldiers tried to move the train the signalmen struck, and all work was stopped. The men employed in the station supplying power to the giant cranes at Dublin wharves were also withdrawn, and the cranes are at a standstill. Some steamers from Ireland to England were held up, owing to the men on the docks refusing to load luggage.

CAVALRY RUSHES IN.

DUBLIN, May 25.—A flying column of cavalry has arrived in the district of West Meath to protect the farms in the region from raiders. Several cattle drives have occurred there during the week. It is stated on what seemingly is good authority that the Sinn Féiners will take action in view of the arrival of the military.

Raiders have attacked and burned the Brandon coast guard station in West Kerry. Six members of the coast guard, aided by their wives and families, desperately resisted the raiders, but were overcome.

Ballyconnell courthouse in County Cavan, which recently was burned and had just been rebuilt, was again burned today.

COURTHOUSE BURNED.

TOBERCERRY, Sligo, Ireland, May 25.—Judge Wakesley was unable to open the quarter sessions here today, because the courthouse was burned down early Monday morning. One hundred armed men participated in the destruction of the building. They picketed all the roads in the vicinity and held up the traffic.

DIDN'T BOTHER WITH BIBLE IN SWEARING LUMBER EMPLOYEES

Witness Admits He Took Affidavits Without Use of Bible.

TORONTO, May 25.—(By Canadian Press.)—Testifying before the Crown Lands investigation this morning, Theodore Ellis, bookkeeper in the Massey Company, said that in taking affidavits from camp clerks and cutters he never required them to swear on a Bible. Two years prior to being employed by the Spanish River Lumber Company he had been a commissioner and had conducted a conveyancing business. He had then always given the oath to persons requiring to make an affidavit. He understood how to swear a man, but did not do it for the Spanish River Company.

J. Parker Reid said that as a cutter he signed his report "J. Parker Reid." As camp clerk he signed the clerks' report "John Reid."

"You're not trying to fool the department," said J. T. Harding, replied the witness. "I'm not trying to fool anybody," replied the witness. "I'm quite sure that anyone in the department reading your returns would think that John Reid and J. Parker Reid were two different people," asked Mr. Justice Latchford. "Did anyone ask you to sign returns that way?" "No, I just did it myself," replied Reid.

"If I guess I have the right to sign my own name if I like," said the witness later.

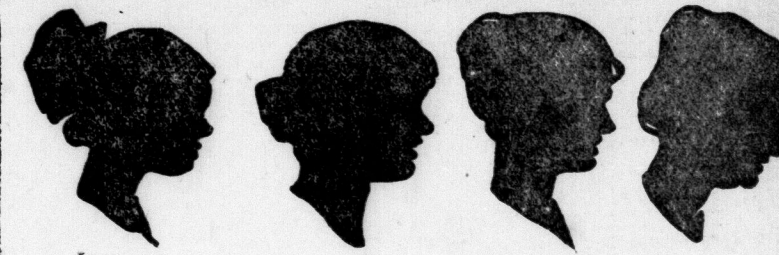

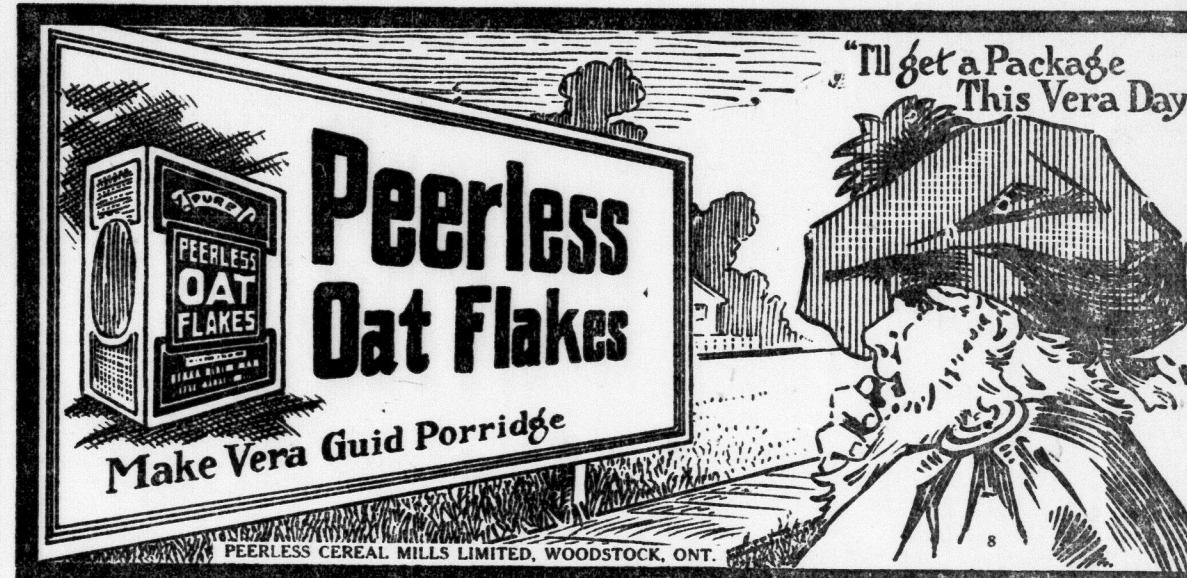
