### SISTERS WILL RESIST RESTORING OF CHILD

Engage Counsel to Oppose Mrs. Longacre's Suit—Evangelists Open Campaign.

HAMILTON, Oct. 15.—(Special).—Labor Candidate Sam Landers held a meeting this evening in the labor hall. It was for the purpose of completing the organization and only members of the labor party and their friends were present. It was an enthusiastic meeting and the labor people are confident of repeating their victory of last June. Addresses were given by the candidate and Allan Studholme, M.L.A.

The fitness of the mother to have the children will be one of the points raised.

"Madams" Fined This Morning. "Madams" who were fined this morning before Police Magistrate Jeffs, who ruled that the courts could not compel them, by sending them to jail for three months, to tell where they got their liquor, so long as they were able and willing to pay a fine. The pair before the magistrate were E. A. Depey and John Toner. Each was sentenced to spend a month in jail or pay a fine of \$20. Depey's fine was promptly paid, but Toner went to jail.

BAREDS GOULD FINANCES. Wife's Alimony Suit Brings Poverty Well From Husband.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—That Howard Gould's income was formerly \$600,000 a year, but since the business depression of last year it has been reduced to \$400,000, and that he has lost \$300,000 this year, was stated by his counsel in an argument before Justice Bishopp to-day. These figures were given in opposing an application by Mrs. Katherine (Clemm) Gould, wife of Howard Gould, for an increase in her alimony from \$25,000 a year to \$120,000.

To support her application Mrs. Gould asserted that her husband's income was \$600,000 a year. Delany Neill, counsel for Mr. Gould, replied that while this was true, Mrs. Gould's income was \$120,000 a year, and that from 1889 to 1893 Mr. Gould gave his wife \$300,000. Mrs. Gould had saved \$200,000 of it. Decision on the increase of alimony was reserved.

Convicted Jury He's Not Inmate. NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—So eloquent was the plea of the defendant in the public schools here, when he addressed the jury to-day in his own behalf against a charge of insanity, that they not only rendered a verdict in his favor, but many of them pressed their hands upon him and invited him to shake hands with them. WRIT FOR LEGISLATOR. Social Democrat Charged With Inciting Army of Unemployed. LONDON, Oct. 15.—The recent demonstrations by the unemployed in Great Britain brought about one result to-day rather than another, which was the issuing of a writ against William James Thorne, Social Democratic member of parliament from the southern division of West Ham, for inciting to a breach of the peace by making a speech in which he advised the unemployed to "push" the baker shops to-day from Nottingham to London. Serious riots were avoided in Sheffield yesterday only when the mayor announced that the sum of \$500,000 would be devoted to relief work.

CHILD UNDER CAR. Almost a Fatality—Was Knocked Under the Fender. A 3-year-old child was almost a victim of a trolley accident on Church-street, at the corner of Charles yesterday morning. The car was stopping for a passenger when the youngster attempted to cross and was knocked down, and rolled under the fender. The body was right against the wheel when the motormen reached it, and beyond severe bruises and clothes ruined by oil and dirt, no damage was done. The youngster's mother had left him to toddle home after she had taken a car. He was carried home by the motormen.
