Schafer Holds One Title.

Jake Schafer successfully defended his title as champion at 151 pounds by defeating George Sutton at Chicago on Monday night, 50 to 48. Schafer holds the highest record ever made in an 181-championship match. In 1898 he ran 400 points in 30 minutes, an average of 400 points a minute. The match was long and drawn-out, but was close enough to keep the spectators interested. Schafer averaged only a fraction of a point more than his opponent, but seemed better able to collect the balls for long runs than Sutton. The challenger took an early lead over Schafer and kept it up until after 24 minutes, when he was 50 points to the good. A few minutes later, however, Schafer got control of the balls, and by executing all sorts of shots, some of them during the extreme, ran 38 points, the high score of the game, and assumed the lead, which Sutton tried vainly to overcome. Sutton's high run was 37.
