

VIEWERS ARE VARIED ON THE POTATO SITUATION

Some Dealers Expect Advance, While Others Say Prices Will Decline.

CUCUMBERS HIGH PRICED

Mushrooms Are Easier and Imported Six-Quart Baskets Sell at Two Dollars.

The views on the potato situation vary greatly on the wholesale. Some expect they will advance, while others think they will be slightly easier. They have been such a slow sale lately, that some of the wholesalers are now selling the New Brunswick Delawares at \$2 to \$2.10 per bag, instead of the \$2.10 to \$2.20 per bag, which was the case a few days ago. The British Columbia variety now on sale, as they have had such unusually cold weather there that large quantities have been frozen in the pits.

The hothouse crop on sale yesterday was not generally of such good quality as has been coming in, and as there was lots of it, it declined to \$2.10 per bushel, from \$2.20 to \$2.30 per bushel.

The hothouse cucumbers are quite high-priced. There are a few small ones in boxes containing a dozen, which are offered at \$2.25 per dozen, but the larger ones bring \$2.40 to \$2.75 per dozen.

Mushtrooms are easier, the imported six-quart baskets selling as low as \$2 per basket; some home-grown ones in pound cartons shipped to White & Co. selling at 50c per case.

New carrots have been quite scarce, and have advanced to \$1 per dozen bunches. The cauliflower on sale is extremely high-priced, as it came in by express, and is selling at \$5 per case, and cauliflower at \$5 per case.
