## self as convinced of the fallacies of free trade doctrines, and urged the necessity of widening the efficiency of the anti-dumping act. The vital consideration, from his viewpoint, was to maintain Canadian industry in a condition which would enable it to afford a comfortable living wage, and assured employment to the country's workers. He touched particularly the farmers' expressed opinions, which declared free trade to be the salvation of the producer from the soil, the solution of the problem of rural depopulation, and which further charged Canadian manufacturers with price-fixing. Free trade, he stated, in answer to these arguments, would mean the ruin of countless manufacturing towns, and the consequent disappearance of a large section of the farmer's present market, thus forcing him to offer his grain in competition to countries already adequately supplied. Rural depopulation, furthermore, could not be attributed to the tariff, as free trade England was experiencing this phenomenon.
