JANUARY, the first month in our present calendar, was also the first in the Roman calendar. It was not the first month of the year in Gt. Britain till 1752, when the Legislature, by an act passed in the preceding year, altered the mode of reckoning time from the Julian to the Gregorian style. It was also directed that the legal year, which commenced on March 25th, should universally be deemed to begin on the first of January. January derives its name from Janus, who, by some accounts, was the son of the sun, and his attributes appear to connect him with sun-worship. He was the porter of Heaven, opening the year and presiding over the seasons. Hence the word Janitor, or keeper of the gate, in colleges, &c. He is commonly repre-
