Moncton, N. B., Oct. 26.—A delegation consisting of President J. T. Hawke, F. W. Sumner, W. H. Edgett, from the Moncton board of trade, visited General Traffic Manager Tiffin today and went into the matter of export and local freight rates affecting Moncton. The Moncton wholesale houses, particularly, have been endeavoring to secure the same rates for flour, grains and feed from western points as granted St. John and other points.
