This is the Estimate of Canada's Surplus---Year One of the

Ottawa, May 10—The final financial returns for the fiscal period ended March 31 last are not yet all to hand, but there is enough to show that the year will be one of the best in the history of the dominion. The revenue for the nime months is \$67, 138,594, but this will be increased by \$2,000,000 when all the collections are made an estimate of \$65,000,000, but it will be about \$4,000,000 more.
