# TO NOON For Failure of British To Invest In Canadian Projects

TINLESS the electors in Saint John go to the polls during the rest of the afternoon and up to 7 o'clock this evening, daylight time, in larger numbers than they did this morning, the total of votes cast in this city in the Federal election of 1926 will be very small. Up to 1.30 o'clock, when Times-Star reporters made calls at several of the booths to test the way in which the electors had responded to the call of the parties to exercise their franchise, only a little more than 15 per cent. it was found, had taken the trouble to go to the polling places and cast their ballots.

In Queens the voting was a little heavier, 68 out of 230 and 54 out of 258 having cast ballots. In this ward about two-thirds of those who voted were women. In Dukes ward the voting was also light, 52 out of 277, and 61 out of 242 having voted up to 2 o'clock at two booths visited. A good proportion of the votes cast here were by women, also.
