London, Aug. 25.—Britain has set out to win the next Olympiad and, if the trick is not pulled off, it will not be the fault of the English public in general which is giving its money to send a crack team to the games in 1924. It has been generally admitted that England has lost much of her athletic supremacy during the last decade, and to regain this a leading London newspaper has started a campaign for \$200,000, the sum estimated as neces-

\$200,000, the sum estimated as necessary to get together a team and send it to the Paris games next year.

The campaign has been on only three weeks, but the flood of small checks has been continuous, and many of the large English firms have sent in donations. Efforts already are being made to form the Olympic team, the training of which is to begin at once under the supervision of the best English coaches.
