

#### NEW YORK DOCTOR SAYS HE HAS CURE

Serum Which Acts to Strengthen Resistance of Cells in Body

FOR CONSUMPTION

New York, Feb. 6-A cure for tubero sis is claimed by Dr. Burgan of this city, and is said by physicians to riva Doctor Burgan also uses a serum, but

Doctor Burgan also uses a serum, but works on a different theory as to the cause of the disease. The method he uses is to inject serum taken from healthy pigs in such a way as to strengthen the resistance of the cells in the body.

He disputes the theory of Doctor Koch as to the cause of the disease. He says that the germ known as the Koch tubercule is a negligible factor and that weak resistance is the real cause. His cure, therefore, disputes that of Doctor Friedmann in that he goes on the hypothesis that injecting germs to kill tuberculosis is of no avail and that the only way is to strengthen the resistance of the body so that germs cannot live in it.

By research lasting thirteen years, Doctor Burgan has developed a serum which he says can accomplish this. He has tested it on a half a dozen patients and given the records of cures affected in each. He says he will furnish the serum to public dispensaries and hospitals at the cost of making it, so that it will be available to the public at a cost low enough to be of service even to the poorest.


