President of King's University is Preacher in Trinity

ST. DAVID'S ADDS 62 TO ITS MEMBERSHIP

Visiting Preacher at Mission Church—Fairville Services Are Ended.

In Trinity church large congregations were present for the various services yesterday. For the three hours service from 10 o'clock to 1 o'clock when the services on the seven last words from the cross were delivered by Rev. A. J. Moore, president of the University of King's College. The church was filled to capacity all the time and very many of the congregation remained throughout the three hours. During the service there were appropriate hymns and prayers were offered.

In the evening the choir, under the direction of James F. Ford, organized, gave a splendid rendering of the Lenten cantata, "The Message from the Cross" by Beethoven, and again the church was brimming.

Rev. C. Gordon Lawrence, rector, conducted the brief opening service. The service was sung by Trinity choir three years ago and those who recalled the impressive and appeal of the former rendering were doubly pleased to hear the inspiring music again this year.

PARIS, April 10.—A reduction of

one son in the price of bread, effective April 21, was ordered by the bread and flour commission today.

This is the third reduction within a month, bringing the price to one franc 10 centimes per kilogram (2.2 pounds). The drop is due to the recent fall in the Canadian and United States wheat market.
