SKIDDED TO SIDEWALK

Declares Some of the Crew Threatened to Cut Him to Pieces

Waiter on Italian Vessel Here is Assured Safety by

Giovanni Pasutti, an articled seaman employed as a waiter on board the Italian steamship Valleyscura, was charged in the Police Court this morn ing by the captain, Batolomeo Doll-becco with absenting himself at divers times between Dec. 28 and Jan. 7 from the ship, and with refusing duty on the ship, and with refusing duty on board the ship. He was remanded to jail by Magistrate Henderson.

Both parties were at a loss for English, and John de Angelis was procured as an interpreter. Through him, Capt. Dollbecco told the court that he had signed Pasutti on in New York and that Pasutti had left the ship when it arrived here and had returned, then left again on last Tuesday, and had not been seen again until yesterday, when Capt. Dollbecco had seen him in the Police Court.

THREATENED, HE SAYS.

Pasutti, in his defence, stated that some members of the crew had threatened to cut him into little pieces with a knife if he remained on board.

The court then asked him why he had laid no complaint against the crew, and Pasutti said that that had been his purpose in coming to the Police Court this morning.

Magistrate Henderson then asked Capt. Dollbecco what he wished done with the man, and he received a request to put Pasutti in jail and keep him there until the Valleyscura sailed.

The accused asked what guarantee he would have for his personal safety when he went back to the ship, and the captain guaranteed that he would personally see to it. This satisfied Pasuttiand he was remanded.


