OUR WEST INDIA TRADE.

Notwithstanding the sneers and attacks of the Globe, our trade with the West Indies is likely to experience a great development during the coming year. Enough has already been done to show that the West India business can be made a large and profitable one and no effort will be spared to bring about this result. The steamers which are to be employed in this service will be new boats specially adapted for it, and the sailings from St. John will be about every twenty-five days. The steamers will call at Halifax, that port being the last point of departure, but on their return they will first come to St. John, so that any heavy freight which is bound for the Uppe provinces will necessarily be discharged at this port. This arrangement, while it will enable the people of Halifax to send their fish to the West Indies regularly, will not interfere with the business of St. John, because we will have the first opportunity of filling up the steamships with freight here and
