With further reference to the above, in the a.m. of the 20th instant, I interviewed Jack KLYNE at Regina Gaol and obtained the following statement from him:-

STATEMENT OF JOHN KLYNE, A.B. Rooms or Ottawa Apart. Regina, Sask.

On Saturday, Aug. 7th, 1943 I met Eddie STONECHILD on 11th Ave. at about 7 or 8 p.m. I did not have any liquor with me. I had had a few drinks of beer before, Eddie had a 26 oz. bottle of wine in his haver-sack. It was Liquor Store stuff. I had a drink out of it. Between 8 to 9.30 p.m. we took a street car at Albert and 11th Ave and went to Priddel's Drug Store to get rubbing alcohol. Before that Eddie got into a fight with a Soldier. I don't know the Soldier or the reason of the fight. I got a 4 oz. bottle of rubbing alcohol at Priddel's Eddy was in the store with me. I don't know if he got one or not. I was pretty drunk at that time. We came back on the street car to 11th Ave. Eddy got off the street car and I lost him and did not see him again until yesterday. I still had my bottle of alcohol the next morning. I had not opened it. Sgd. John Klyne.
