I may add that if you will have filed here a plan of the Indian Reserve excluding therefrom the said Lots 19 and 20, the necessary action will be taken to obtain the authority of the Governor in Council, setting apart the Reserve which will include Lots 12, 13, 16, 17 and Lots 21 to 30 inclusive.

The following is a statement of the standing of the surveyed Lots in Fairford Settlement lying south of the river:

Number 14: Hudson's Bay Company land.


Numbers 12, 13 and numbers 21 to 30 inclusive: Available.

Numbers 15, 16 and 17: Claimed by Treaty Indians.

Numbers 18, 19, 20, 31 and 32: Disposed of.

As Treaty Indians are not eligible to acquire Dominion Lands, Lots numbered 15, 16 and 17 would also appear to be available.
