Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Homestead Regulations.

Any even numbered section of Domirion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 25, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or maic over 3 years of age, to the extent of one-quarts section, of 180 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry much be made in person by the applicant to the other coal agent or Sub-Agent. Entry by proxy may, however, bo made on certain conditions by the faths, mother, son, daughter, brother or sub-agent of an intending homesteader.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-Agent 3 officer may be wired to the local agent by the Sub-Agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacca?

Sub-Agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are received by mail. In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim. An application for inspection must be made in person. The applicant must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for inspection will be received from an individual until that application has been disposed of. has been disposed of.

A homesteader whose entry is in good standing, and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to approval of Denartment relinquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one else, on filling declaration of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily canceller, or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to the applicant for inspection wititled to prior right of entry. Applicants for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in material ment is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry, should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.

DUTIES.—A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in "ba vicinity of the land entered for by such person residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention tedoso.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of \$2 per cent. collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.
