Miramichi Advance. Provincial Notes and News.

SAW MILL AT FRENCH RIVER. Messrs. White & Cowie are putting up a Watersaw rotary saw mill, formerly owned by Carter & Alexander of Bathurst, at French River, Carleton Co.

THE GUNS AT NEGROVINE POINT, ST. JOHN. The five rifled guns for Negrovine Point have arrived from England. They are sixty-four pounders, and are what are termed "converted guns," old cast iron thirty-two pounders bored out and rifled steel tube inserted.

A TEMPERANCE REVIVAL. A great temperance revival has lately arisen in the Upper and Lower Provinces. In Ontario the movement has been conducted by Mr. Rine with great success, and in Nova Scotia, Mr. Mackenzie in the East and Mr. Dutcher in the West, have given the cause quite an impetus.

TUTTLE'S HISTORY OF THE DOMINION. The first volume of Tuttle's Popular History of the Dominion is now ready for delivery and will be placed in the hands of subscribers as soon as the agent can reach them. This volume contains 525 pages, quarto, and 125 engravings, including portraits of our leading public men, and views of important places and descriptions of the principal events in Canadian history.

THE INLAND STEAMER ANDREA, in the Caribbean Sea, encountered a hurricane on September 27th. A large amount of property was destroyed, and there is great distress. A WHISKY RIOT. An Owen Sound despatch of recent date, says that since the commencement of the liquor prosecutions a reign of terror has existed. At the close of the Magistrate's Court on the 26th, Inspector Pearce was seriously wounded in the head, and the County Attorney Bennett and others, more or less hurt with stones. The Inspector fired and wounded a man in the leg.

THE DOMINION GOVERNMENT STEAMERS DRUID and NAPOLION III have left Quebec for the Lower St. Lawrence and Gulf to take up the buoy. DUNDON AND ARTHURVILLE. A petition has been filed against the return of Mr. Beauchamp on the ground of bribery, treating, and undue clerical influence.

THE SOUTH-EASTERN RAILWAY. A despatch from Montreal, dated Nov. 3rd, says a receiver will be appointed for the South Eastern Railway, and the difficulties with the road will be left with the courts to settle.

ARCTIC DISCOVERY. A bill has been introduced into the United States Congress to authorize another expedition to discover the North Pole. A similar bill was favorably reported on last session, by the Naval Committee.

THE DUKE DE CASES, Minister of foreign affairs, has resigned, and President McMahon has asked Poncey Fuetier, President of the Financial Committee, and member of the Left Centre, to form a Government which has had a conciliatory effect. The ministers simply announce the prorogation of the chambers for 15 days.

PROGRESS OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHT. The electrical illumination of the railway station at Lyons, France, is completed, and the experiment is pronounced a success. Twelve electric lamps are now in use, and twelve more are being prepared. All will be fed with one light-producing and one distributing machine.

TRAMPS IN EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA. Tramps have become unendurable, in Eastern Pennsylvania, and their ill-effects amounts to \$75,000 yearly. The people have petitioned the legislature suggesting that lodging be provided at certain points, and that money be saved to the country by road and other works, executed by these gentlemen.

THE TELEPHONE. Since Prof. Bell has been in England, he has succeeded in passing the sound clearly through a line equal to about 3,000 miles, and it is fully expected that all difficulties of resistance will be overcome and the special requirements of musical vibration be fully met. The infant invention is one of great promise, and may ultimately supersede entirely the Morse alphabet.

A CHANCE FOR SINGLE LADIES. A society for the bettering of "single ladies" is advocated by the Toronto Telegram. It paints an accredited member salting forth on his errand of love, with the necessary accoutrements of his profession, including an umbrella, overcoat, camp stool, fan, opera glass, shawl, smelling salts, and other feminine necessities, escorting some fair damsel to a performance which she would otherwise be prevented from attending.

GEN. GRANT CAUGHT AT LAST. General Grant has, so far during his visit to Europe, avoided saying anything indiscreet, but the French newspaper men were too much for him. "He declined to express an opinion on the political situation there. He said his first impression of France was that it was a prosperous, well-ordered happy aspect," and this under the Dictator MacMahon!

THE ANGLICAN-AMERICAN TRADE MARK TREATY. A despatch dated Washington, Nov. 4th, says: "The Trade Mark Treaty between the United States and Great Britain provides that subjects or citizens of each country have each the same right as subjects or citizens of the other, or as are now or may hereafter be granted to the subjects or citizens of the most favored nation in everything relating to trade marks and trade labels."
