REPORTS AND DISASTERS. Boston, Dec 14—Br steamer Blackheath, Capt M H Scott, arrived yesterday afternoon after a passage of 24 hours from the straits. The decks were raked by the seas and some of the officers' rooms were flooded. One member threw one of the lifeboats from the deck and did minor damage to the deck fittings.

Parrabro, N. S., Dec 14—Tug Parrabro, while towing stern schooner Alice P Turner from Matiland to Parrabro, lost her propeller fouled with the hawser and had to anchor when she came here and cleared propeller.

Quebec, Dec 12—Captain James H. Macdonald, commanding the schooner Royal George, whose certificate was suspended for one year by the Commissioners who inquired into the cause of the stranding of the vessel, will appeal from the judgment delivered recently in the matter at Montreal. He will enter this appeal with the British Board of Trade as soon as he reaches England.
