FARMING MATTERS IN ENGLAND
In England and Wales the farming outlook is much more gloomy than in Scotland. Soomoon who travelled last week to the Royal Show at Cardiff are much struck with the drought-affected areas through which they passed. The hay crop is exceedingly light, and a general scarcity of hay is certain. Other kinds of fodder will be limited in quantity. Oat straw, which is one of the best substitutes for hay, appears to be short in bulk, so that there will be need for the extra straw in Scotland this year. Many of the oat crops are little more than a foot high, and as they are developing the ear the prospect is not encouraging. Apart from some useful crops in Harefordshire, there was hardly a field of turnips or mangold to be seen on the journey between Perth and Cardiff. From other parts of England doubtful reports were received at the Show of the condition of the crops generally. The drought ended too late to avert serious injury, and its stunting influence has been widespread. In York- shire the crops are described as "serious." Hay is about 25 per cent. below the average; roots are reported to be "practically non-existent," potatoes are growing slowly, and "the prospect for the cereal harvest is bad." The corn on a good deal of the newly ploughed land has suffered considerably, and straw generally is short.
