





SPONGE CARE. Half a pound of pow-dered sugar, quarter of a pound of flour, four eggs, juice of one lemon. Drop from a spoon upon buttered paper; if the mixture runs add more flour. Bake in a quick oven.

A Nice Muppin for Breakfast.— Two cups of oatmest, one cup of flur, one large spoonful of butter, one large spoonful of molasses, one small teaspoonful of soda. Use milk enough to make the batter about like griddle cakes.

WHITE CUP-CAKE.—Four pounds of sugar and one of butter; beat five eggs with the sugar, put one teaspoonful of soda in a cup of sour milk; grate one nutmen and put in it, with one teaspoonful of cinnamon. Then cream the butter and flur tegether, add the eggs and sugar and other ingredients; soft well and bake is a tin mould.

LEMON TARGLESS.—Rub a teacupful of sugar in lumps over the rind of a fresh femon scas to absorb all the essectial cit, squeeze the juice of the femon over the surgar; crush it him with a spoon; add to it two eggs, well beaten, and two tablespionals of sweet Lutter, beat all together, and take in little patty pans, lined with puffinaste.


