the requisite qualifications, may grant them certificates of capacity as veterinary surgeons.

Records of their transactions, &c.

17. The said Boards shall keep a Record of their respective transactions, and shall, from time to time, publish, in such manner as to secure the widest circulation among the Agricultural Societies and 5 farmers, all Reports, Essays, Lectures and other information as the Boards may consider useful to the public:

Board to publish a Journal of Agriculture.

2. The Boards shall publish a Journal, or adopt, as their channel of communication with Agricultural Societies, the Agricultural Journals now published in Upper and Lower Canada respectively.

Copy of pro-Bureau.

18. The said Boards shall forthwith transmit to the Bureau of Agriceedings, &c., culture a copy of their proceedings, and at the commencement of each year a detailed statement of receipts and disbursements made up to the thirty-first December of the previous year.

Boardito continue to be body corporate.

19. The Boards shall continue to be bodies corporate, and may 15 acquire and hold land and real and personal property for the purposes of their incorporation and may sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the same.

## HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

How and where to be formed.

20. Any number of persons, not less than twenty-five, may organize 20 and form themselves into a Horticultural Society for any city, town, village, township or parish, or union of two or more thereof together, either in Upper or Lower Canada, by signing a declaration in the form or Schedule C to this Act annexed (but with the necessary alteration as to the name of the Society), and subscribing a sum of not less than 25 forty dollars annually to the funds thereof.

Declaration of Members.

21. Such declaration shall be in duplicate, and one part thereof shall be written and signed on the first page or pages of a book to be kept by the Society for recording the minutes of its proceedings during the first year of its existence, and the other part thereof shall be written 30 and signed on a sheet of paper or parchment, and shall forthwith be Copy to Min-sent by post to the Minister of Agriculture, who shall, as soon as may inter of Agri- he after the receipt thereof, cause a notice of the formation of such Society to be inserted in the Canada Gazette.

Society to be 22. Upon the insertion in the Canada Gazette of the notice of the 35 formation of any such society, it shall become a Corporation for the objects and purposes hereinafter mentioned, by the name applied to it in such notice, which shall be the same as that in the declaration transmitted by such society, and may acquire and hold, lease and mortgage and alienate property, real and personal, for the purpose of such 40 Society.

Power to make Bylaws.

23. Every Horticultural Society incorporated under this Act may make By-laws, not being contrary to the laws of this Province or to this Act, for prescribing the mode of admission of new members and election of officers, and otherwise regulating the administration of its 45 affairs and property.

Meetings of Society.

24. Every such Society shall hold a meeting in the first week of the month of February, in each year, besides meetings at such other times
