Age is no longer a barrier in the working world, says Merle Billson of Ideal Personnel.

She is a grandmother '51-years-young' who owns the company and is surrounded by an "incredible staff" of even women all over 30, and all with diversified office

Merle has been in personnel for nine years and she says it's the only job she's ever had that she thoroughly enjoys. Already established in the personnel field, she became office manager for Mr. Lawson, second owner of Ideal Personnel, five-and-a-half years ago. At that time it was a two-girl office located at Bloor and Dixie. She later became a partner and a year and a half ago became owner. Last summer the company moved to Dixie Plaza on Dundas

"In my 20 years of business experience, I've always been treated as an equal on a business basis," Merle

says.
"Of course, I've got a supercool husband. Rich is successful in his own field as writer and training specialist for CN Telecommunications and he enjoys my success too.

Working in personnel is a high-pressured job that looks glamorous on the outside, but involves a lot of hard work. To make things run more smoothly, Merle eliminated commission and pays her staff salary plus bonuses. It eliminates conflicts, she says.

"I never thought I could work in an all-girl office and enjoy it," says Carole Newman, a counsellor, "but the girls have become my best friends, we all have outgoing personalities yet are totally different and the flexible office conditions establish a good feeling.

"The hardest part of the job is to accept the fact that people disappoint you occasionally, but you just can't get bored, there's always new people but it's hard not to get emotionally involved with your applicants."

Carole visits Applewood secondary school every year to talk to the girls. "Students are timid about that first interview and we can offer them some motherly advice." 'The sharp juniors are my favorites," says Carole

"It's often difficult to place them because they have no experience, but they are anxious to put their typing and shorthand skills to work. We really go to bat for them, and it's really satisfying to get them a job." The most motivated applicants are women from 22 to

35 who want a challenging position. Businesses however, hesitate to hire women to promotion-type jobs unless they have a stationary lifestyle. "One married woman with children in school had taken a course at Humber College and came in here with holes in the soles of her feet after walking all day. We

were able to place her. It's moments like that that make the job rewarding," says Carole The woman over 45 is usually looking for a secure job in pleasant surroundings with no pressure, and employers are more and more looking for maturity and

Most personnel agencies give typing, shorthand, bookkeeping and dicta tests to assess an applicant's

English and mathtests assess ability. Mechanical skills are important, but so is grooming and personality. When placing a woman, the counsellor considers the office ennt, formal or informal, and tries to place an applicant in a position where she will be happy and want to stay. Reference checks are always made

Jobs are not that plentiful but the job market is always

Merle thinks, however, that even an inexperienced girl can get a job. "We've all been in that position at one time or another, hang in there, someone will give you a

chance," she says.
"More and more employers are realizing their time is very valuable and have a dependable agency apply their skills of artistry in matching up the client with the applicant.
