

PCO A's still tied after exhausting week

MISSISSAUGA — Coach Bob Taylor's axiom that games are won and lost in the third period was never more apparent when they dropped an 18-13 decision to Lakeshore Leafs Sunday.

Lakeshore outscored PCO's 7-3 in the final frame to clinch the win and maintain the four-way tie that exists for top spot. Lakeshore has a game in hand though.

There may have been some reason for the third-period let-down that Taylor fears so much. His club had just been through an exhausting set of games beginning last Tuesday when Etobicoke took advan-

tage of a dormant Mississauga offence to eke out a 12-11 win.

Then there was the big game with Oshawa two nights later and one of the most shocking wins ever — Mississauga 22, Oshawa 10, at Oshawa. It was the great upset that Mississauga had been looking for in several years.

The next night, Taylor received a superb defence as the club edged Bramalea 11-9 in Bramalea. So, it stood to reason that a well-rested Leaf club could wear down the PCO's.

The fact remains that Lakeshore, in two meetings thus far this year, have managed to handle PCO's quite easily. The test will come later, though, when Lakeshore must play Mississauga twice at Port Credit Arena.

Rick Dudley was the big gun for PCO's in the game against Lakeshore. He fired

four goals and had three assists while John Chelo came through with three goals. The club's leading scorer, captain Al Gordaneer, notched a pair but added five assists. Other goals went to Kevin Biss, Bob Gardner, Pat Differ and Paul Cioci.

For Lakeshore, big Bill Coghill clicked on six occasions and earned four assists. The game was a typical Lakeshore - Mississauga contest — very rough. Doug Gray and Bill Perras were involved in fights with Ron McVaugh and Mike Patton. Almost all the penalties were the high sticking or roughing type. Dudley earned a misconduct for arguing an interference call.

MISSISSAUGA 22 OSHAWA 10
PCO's just kept pouring it on in Oshawa. Oshawa simply grew tired of facing the in-

cessant onslaught of the PCO's who ran the Green Gaels into submission.

The onslaught showed on the scoreboard when PCO's fired 10 goals in the middle frame and seven in the third while Oshawa could manage only six over the last two periods.

Al Gordaneer again led the attack with four goals and an assist while Dudley had three goals and three assists. Differ, Perras, Frank Oda and Gardner added another three. Burton, Gordaneer, Gray and Chelo each picked up singles while Cioci and Differ earned three assists apiece. Bramalea was led by Murray Shannon with a goal and two assists.

The game was marred by two fights when Biss tangled with Pete Vipond and Greg Powless battled Dave Mosler. Oshawa's Terry Rowland was particularly aggressive and

earned 22 minutes in penalties. Lou Clare had 14 including a misconduct.

Mississauga and Bramalea have the two best defences in the league according to goals against and the teams played that way. To top it all, PCO's were minus their ace defence star, Frank Oda, but still put forth a solid effort.

Dudley topped the scoring parade with four goals and Gardner added another three. Burton, Gordaneer, Gray and Chelo each picked up singles while Cioci and Differ earned three assists apiece. Bramalea was led by Murray Shannon with a goal and two assists.

Lou Clare, who rejoined the team for the win against Etobicoke, was promptly thrown out with a match misconduct for a kicking charge. Oshawa's Terry Rowland was particularly aggressive and
