FINAL WING PARADE

This afternoon at 1.30 o'clocka Wings Parade will be held at No. 1 SFTS, Camp Borden. This will be the final and largest wings parade and graduation ceremony of the Camp and will officially mark the conclusion of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan.

More than 100 airmen will graduate, including RCAF. RAF, RAAF, RNZAF and RNAF. There will an impressive parade on the tarmac with the aircraft of the School lined up and Group Captain J. B. Harvey will present the wings. Similar ceremonies have been or will be held at other British Commonwealth Air Training Schools across Canada. While the graduating class at Borden today will be the final under the Commonwealth Plan, it is not expected this Camp will be closed. No announcement rewarding the future of the RCAF Camp at Borden has yet been made.
