



Sir,-



It is thought, however, that he is in error in making this statement as according to the books of the Department Mary Clair belongs to Bad Boy's Band T. No. 37, Blackfoot Agency. I shall be glad if you will kindly ascertain for the information of the Department to which Band the deceased actually did belong. I may add that there is \$5.10 standing at her credit in the books of the Department, and if, as is supposed, she is a member of Bad Boy's Band the Department desires to receive from you the name of her heir and also a recommendation in regard to the disposition of the money.
