Dear Mr. Hewcombe,-

To give effect to a verbal agreement between the Dominion and Ontario with reference to the islands in Lake Huron, a memorandum to Council was drafted by me and sent to Mr. Aubrey White, Deputy Minister of Lends and Forests for the Province of Ontario, for its conourrence. I am in receipt of a letter from him, dated the 9th of October, in which no objection is taken to the proposed memorandum; he states, however, that the Minister of Lands and Forests thinks that a clause should be put in the memorandum "making it clear that it does " not asttle the question as to the rights of the Dom-" inion to sell Indian lands or in any way change our " legal rights with respect to the lands or the pro-" ceeds of the sale of Indian lands".

I am sending you herewith a copy of Mr. White's letter with the proposed clause and I would be obliged if you would favour me with an opinion as to whether this clause should be adopted.
