With reference to your letter of the 29th instant, reletive to the price of coffine for deceased members of the moravian hand; I beg to say that the Band should only be asked to pay for those indigent Indians who are utterly unable to bear the expense. Indian families in comfortable circumstances should pay any such costs. The sum of \$15.00 now granted is so much so the Pand funds will stand, and the best arrangement will be for the Band to allow the grant of \$15.00 to be paid, and the family or the deceased pay the balance, and in cases where the family on pay all, they should do so.

In the event of the family being destitute and unable to pay anything, the shell could be eliminated thus reducing the cost and the Band would pay, but the price would then equal the grant of \$15.00.

The matter should be laid before the Council and procedure as outlined taken and report made to the Department.
