PART A - AIRWAYS

(j) All pursonnel (not passengers) using the international routes must possess and carry upon their person at all times during international travel, an international personnel license to-gether with a book of international aerial regulations which may be obtained through their local authorities and will be issued by the Aerial Sub-Council License Department.

NOTE

In this manner a check may be made upon undesirable persons, who may not be known to the nations or people employing them, (Transients) or upon subvarsive activities.

- (k) International licenses will be granted to such aircraft by the Aerial Sub-Council with whom such craft must be registered, but obtainable through their local authorities.
- (1) All aircraft must carry an approved distinguishing national mark and number, as issued by the

approved agent of the Aerial Sub-Council in the country of origin and registered with the Aerial Sub-Council.

(m) Should any aircraft crash in another country and is proved to have been unsuitable for international travel, then the <u>country</u> in which the machine is registered would be held responsible and must pay for the damages or loss of life.
