Security and Freedom - also Basic Principles.

Of Security and Freedom it may be said that they are opposite sides of the same shield. One cannot be free without a sense of security. One cannot feel secure so long as freedom itself is threatened. The essence of both security and freedom, it seems to me, lies in the elimination of fear. Fear, in some

measure, will always be present. In one respect, it is Nature's method of breeding caution. Excessive fear, however, is paralysing in its effect. As fears increase, men lose their sense of security. With the loss of security, freedom also disappears.

There is, however, more to freedom than merely freedom from fear. Freedom also has its positive side. On the positive side, Freedom may perhaps best be defined as opportunity for the individual, free from undue fear, to develop his whole personality.
