

UPPER SCHOOL

Forms V. b, V middle and V. a.—A graded three years' course in Religious Knowledge; English Literature, Grammar and Composition; English and Canadian History; Geography; Arithmetic, Algebra and Geometry; Latin; French; German, Spanish or Science (Physics and Chemistry); Sewing; Drill; Class Singing.

Forms VI. b and VI. a.—Preparation for Junior and Honour Matriculation, University of Toronto.

It is expected that the whole course mapped out for the Lower and Middle School shall be followed, but where circumstances make it advisable, a selection is allowed, subject to the approval of the Principal.

In the Upper School, the curriculum is, on the contrary, directed into courses, particulars of which will be found in the earlier part of the calendar.

Instruction in General Religious Knowledge and in the Holy Scriptures is given by the Principal and by the Chaplain of the School, and all pupils attend the classes.
