A fine fire place of quarter cut white oak is one of the features of this room. In the fire place can be burned either coal or wood. The room is finished in white oak, with white birch waxed floor. Note the drop gas light which adds a distinctive feature in the furnishing of the library. Acetylene gas is burned in this light. While all Canadian farmers cannot have some of the comforts which Mr. Howell has, many of them could be obtained with less effort than is imagined.
